The Profound Biblical Concept of Love: A Guiding Light for Humanity

"Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

Love is a fundamental theme woven throughout the pages of the Bible, serving as a guiding principle that transcends time and cultural boundaries. 
Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:
