Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Happy Resurrection Day!! Did you ever just think about Easter and all that it is and means? So, you have, well anyway, I am going to share a few things with you today as well. Possibly known as useless facts, but nonetheless, interesting. Easter is the principal festival of the Christian church, which celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his crucifixion. The earliest recorded observance of an Easter celebration was in the 2nd century. Easter is normally observed on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox (March 21). Easter, therefore can fall on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25.

Easter, like Christmas, has accumulated a great many traditions, some of which have little to do with the Christian celebration of the Resurrection but derive from folk customs. The custom of the Easter Lamb is one. "Behold the lamb of God which takes away the sins of the world," John 1:29 and the lamb's role as a sacrificial animal in ancient Egypt. In antiquity Christians placed lamb meat under the altar, had it blessed, and then ate it on Easter. Now, something we all have done as a child, the painting and decorating of Easter eggs was first recorded in the 13th century. The church prohibited the eating of eggs during Holy week, but chickens, of course, continued to lay them during that week and the notion of specially identifying those as "Holy Week" eggs brought their decoration. The egg itself became a symbol of the Resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from the tomb, the egg symbolizes new life emerging from the eggshell. A little something to share as you celebrate Easter this year. Now you know!
